



Kitch firm attorney Adam Kutinsky earns CPCU Designation

The American Institute for CPCU is an independent, nonprofit educational organization that confers the CPCU designation for completion of eight rigorous courses and national examinations and for meeting special ethics and experience requirements. All CPCUs are required to maintain and to improve their professional knowledge, skills, and competence through their commitment to the American Institute's Code of Professional Ethics.



Adam is a Principal of the Kitch law firm and takes a leadership role in its insurance and commercial litigation practices.
